

Curses of Adam

The curses of Adam laid on Christ.

Christ was taken in the Garden of Gathemane to be punished for the sin of Adam.

This is the Garden of Gathemane the location where Christ was TAKEN to suffer in place of Adam.

Adam was sent out of the Garden to die just like Christ was taken from the Garden to die.

Luke 22:39 And he came out, and went, as he was wont, to the mount of Olives; and his disciples also followed him.

40 And when he was at the place, he said unto them, Pray that **ye enter not into temptation.**

They were told about praying about entering Temptation of Satan in the Garden.

Matt 26:36 Then **cometh Jesus with them unto a place called Gethsemane**, and saith unto the disciples, Sit ye here, while I go and pray yonder.

Here we begin to see the we see the curses that were laid on Adam were placed on Christ.

The sorrow and agony.

Genesis 3:17 And unto Adam he said, Because thou hast hearkened unto the voice of thy wife, and hast eaten of the tree, of which I commanded thee, saying, Thou shalt not eat of it: cursed is the ground for thy sake; **in sorrow shalt thou eat of it all the days of thy life;**

Here is Jesus admitting being Sorrowful unto death.

Matt 26:38 Then saith he unto them, **My soul is exceeding sorrowful, even unto death:** tarry ye here, and watch with me.

Then we see the Sweat of the BROW. This is because of what was cursed on Adam.

Genesis 3:19 **In the sweat of thy face shalt thou eat bread, till thou return unto the ground;** for out of it wast thou taken: for dust thou art, and unto dust shalt thou return.

The sweat of His brow began to sweat blood.

Luke 22:44 And being in an agony he prayed more earnestly: and **his sweat was as it were great drops of blood falling down to the ground.**

Adam touched the tree that brought forth Death.

Genesis 3:3 But of the fruit of the tree which is in the midst of the garden, God hath said, Ye shall not eat of it, **neither shall ye touch it, lest ye die.**

Christ had to carry the tree that brought for death.

John 19:17 And **he bearing his cross** went forth into a place called the place of a skull, which is called in the Hebrew Golgotha:

Here we continue to see the punishment of the curses of Adam on Christ.

Genesis 3:18 **Thorns also and thistles shall it bring forth to thee;** and thou shalt eat the herb of the field;

Christ had to suffer the Thorns and thistles by placing a crown of Thorns on His head.

Matt 27:29 And when they had platted a **crown of thorns, they put it upon his head**, and a reed in his right hand: and they bowed the knee before him, and mocked him, saying, Hail, King of the Jews!

Adam was told he would eat the herbs of the field.

Genesis 3:18 Thorns also and thistles shall it bring forth to thee; and **thou shalt eat the herb of the field;**

They fed Jesus the poisonous herbs of the field called hemlock which is the Gall.

Matt 27:34 **They gave him vinegar to drink mingled with gall:** and when he had tasted thereof, he would not drink.

This is fulfilling the prophesy of Psalm 69 for gal which is a herb of the field.

Psalm 69:21 **They gave me also gall for my meat;** and in my thirst they gave me vinegar to drink.

Gall is said to be Hyssop which is an herb of the field.

John 19:29 Now there was set a vessel full of vinegar: and they filled a sponge with vinegar, and **put it upon hyssop**, and put it to his mouth.

The same word for Gall is Rosh which is translated hemlock which is the poisonous herb of field.

Hosea 10:4 They have spoken words, swearing falsely in making a covenant: thus judgment springeth up as **hemlock in the furrows of the field.**

Could be mixture of poison in the herb of hemlock or be just hyssop either way its herb of field

Adam was naked in shame.

Genesis 3:10 And he said, I heard thy voice in the garden, and I was afraid, **because I was naked;** and I hid myself.

Christ was stripped naked in shame.

John 19:23 **Then the soldiers, when they had crucified Jesus, took his garments,** and made four parts, to every soldier a part; and also his coat: now the coat was without seam, woven from the top

throughout.

Adam was born with a miraculous birth by God breathing life into the dust.

Genesis 1:7 And the Lord God formed man of the dust of the ground, and breathed into his nostrils the breath of life; and man became a living soul.

Christ was born miraculous by the breath of God breathed into the woman who came from dust.

Luke 1:35 And the angel answered and said unto her, **The Holy Ghost shall come upon thee**, and the power of the Highest shall overshadow thee: therefore also that holy thing which shall be born of thee shall be called the Son of God.

Christ died in the place and likeness of Adam who had brought the curse on all mankind.

Romans 5:14 Nevertheless death reigned from Adam to Moses, even over them that had not sinned after the similitude of Adam's transgression, **who is the figure of him that was to come**.

Through Christ dying in the place of Adam , He was able to lift the curse of death off mankind.
