The story of Mary is foreshadow of the end times and the prophesy of the next Exodus.

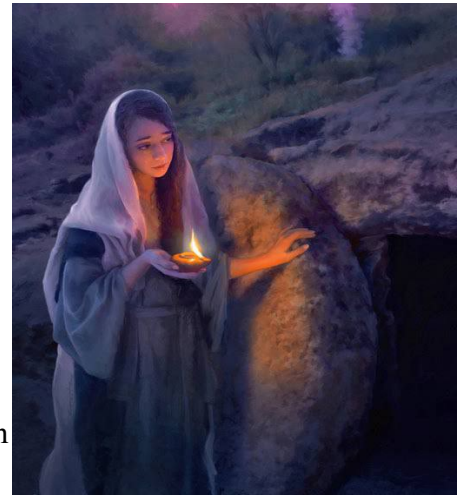
Mary was the woman who went out with a candle and sat in the dark at the resurrection waiting to see the Lord.

John 20:1 The first day of the week cometh **Mary Magdalene early, when it was yet dark**, unto the sepulchre, and seeth the stone taken away from the sepulchre.

She had a lamp with her to go in the dark to the rock caves to meet the Lord.

As a bride running out to meet her bride groom.

Matt 25:1 Then shall the kingdom of heaven be likened unto ten virgins, which took their lamps, and went forth to meet the bridegroom.



2 And five of them were wise, and five were foolish.

3 They that were foolish took their lamps, and took no oil with them:

4 But the wise took oil in their vessels with their lamps.

This is the parable of the candles in the exodus as Mary who went out to meet the Lord.

Rev 12:6 And the woman fled into the wilderness, where she hath a place prepared of God, that they should feed her there a thousand two hundred and threescore days.

We see the woman going out to the wilderness to petra.

When this woman leaves Jerusalem.. she takes with her all the candles in the city to go into the wilderness knowing that it will be dark at the tombs on the day of the Lords resurrection.



The city will then no longer hear the voice of the bride and she will take all the candles with her.

Revelation 18:23 And **the light of a candle shall shine no more at all in thee**; and the voice of the bridegroom and of the bride shall be heard no more at all in thee: for thy merchants were the great men of the earth; for by thy sorceries were all nations deceived.

This is the story of Mary going out to meet the Lord at the rock tombs with a candle in the dark during the time of the Resurrection.

The city will have no candles left.
