

Weep and mourn

The prophesy of Jesus weeping and rejoicing prophesy.

Jesus while on the earth warned those who weep now will rejoice latter and those who rejoice now will weep latter.

This is prophetic foreshadow of what is to come.

Luke 6:26 Woe unto you that are full! for ye shall hunger. **Woe unto you that laugh now! for ye shall mourn and weep.**

This is prophetic turn for what is to come.

Both the Resurrection and the Sacking of the beast at Temple.

Jesus wept over the dead and will rejoice latter.

John 11:23 Jesus saith unto her, **Thy brother shall rise again.**

24 Martha saith unto him, I know that he shall rise again **in the resurrection at the last day.**

The context is about this weeping is over the dead and Resurrection

John 11:33 When Jesus therefore **saw her weeping**, and the **Jews also weeping** which came with her, he groaned in the spirit, and was troubled.

34 And said, Where have ye laid him? They said unto him, Lord, come and see.

35 Jesus wept.

36 Then said the Jews, Behold how he loved him!

Then the Resurrection

John 11:43 And when he thus had spoken, he cried with a loud voice, **Lazarus, come forth.**

44 And **he that was dead came forth**, bound hand and foot with graveclothes: and his face was bound about with a napkin. Jesus saith unto them, Loose him, and let him go.

The Resurrection: Rejoicing latter

Rev 19:7 Let us be glad and **rejoice**, and give honour to him: for the marriage of the Lamb is come, and his wife hath made herself ready.

Clothed in white from Resurrection bodies and garments.

Rev 19:8 And to her was granted that she should be arrayed in fine linen, clean and white: for the fine linen is the righteousness of saints.

Now the Rejoicing over the Sacking of the Temple.

Jesus looking over Jerusalem wept in regards to end times prophesy of Jerusalem being sacked and the beast taking it and Jesus taking the temple from the beast driving the beast out.

Luke 19:41 And when he was come near, **he beheld the city, and wept over it,**

42 Saying, If thou hadst known, even thou, at least in this thy day, the things which belong unto thy peace! but now they are hid from thine eyes.

43 For the **days shall come upon thee, that thine enemies shall cast a trench about thee,** and compass thee round, and keep thee in on every side,

44 And shall lay thee even with the ground, and **thy children within thee;** and they shall not leave in thee one stone upon another; because thou knewest **not the time of thy visitation.**

Then He begins to reference the casting out the money changers from the temple the prophetic allegory of His return removing the beast from the Temple of God at Jerusalem.

Luke 19:45 And **he went into the temple, and began to cast out** them that sold therein, and them that bought;

46 Saying unto them, It is written, My house is the house of prayer: but ye have made it a den of thieves.

Rejoicing over the beast sacking of Jerusalem and Christ sacking the beast.

Those who rejoiced over killing apostles and Jesus will weep latter.

The apostles prophets and heaven will rejoice over this.

Rev 18:19 And they cast dust on their heads, and cried, **weeping and wailing,** saying, Alas, alas that great city, wherein were made rich all that had ships in the sea by reason of her costliness! for in one hour is she made desolate.

20 Rejoice over her, thou heaven, and ye holy apostles and prophets; for God hath avenged you on her.

Christ will rejoice at the Resurrection and the sacking of Jerusalem end times.

Those who kill the two prophets will rejoice at the end of the tribulation.

Rev 11:10 And **they that dwell upon the earth shall rejoice over them,** and make merry, and shall send gifts one to another; **because these two prophets tormented them** that dwelt on the earth.

Your rejoicing over killing us will not last long but a few days before you are made to weep and mourn.

Matt 24:30 And then shall appear the sign of the Son of man in heaven: and then shall all the tribes of the earth mourn, and they shall see the Son of man coming in the clouds of heaven with power and great glory.

The wailing seeing Christ.

Rev 1:Behold, he cometh with clouds; and every eye shall see him, and they also which pierced him: and **all kindreds of the earth shall wail because of him.** Even so, Amen.

The things that have been covering in the prophesy allegories in all that foreshadow everything about Christ and his return is because its the Spirit of prophesy.

This is all because the things Jesus said are all prophetic and will be fulfilled latter in things He said. The testimony of Jesus Himself is the Spirit of prophesy

Rev 19:10 And I fell at his feet to worship him. And he said unto me, See thou do it not: I am thy fellowservant, and of thy brethren that have the testimony of Jesus: worship God: **for the testimony of Jesus is the spirit of prophecy.**
