

Which is to come

The one who was and is and is to come prophesy.

Christ is the reference to the word of God who became flesh.

The things that are written in past present and future are embodiment of Christ himself.

John 1:1 In the **beginning was the Word**, and the Word was with God, and **the Word was God**.

2 The same was in the beginning with God.

3 All things were made by him; and without him was not any thing made that was made.

Bible says the Word is God.

You can also see that the word of God became flesh which clearly denotes God became flesh.

John 1:14 **And the Word was made flesh, and dwelt among us**, (and we beheld his glory, the glory as of the only begotten of the Father,) full of grace and truth.

Now with this as the example defining the Almighty as God who became flesh. Look to what the prophesy says about the Almighty.

Rev 1:I am Alpha and Omega, the beginning and the ending, saith the Lord, **which is**, and **which was**, and **which is to come**, the Almighty.

This says that the Almighty “Which is, Which was, and which is to come.”

Which is what?

This can be understood as the following:

Which is **alive**, which was **dead** which is to **return**.

Rev 1:**I am he that liveth, and was dead**; and, behold, I am alive for evermore, Amen; and have the keys of hell and of death.

We see that its Christ who lives who was dead. And what about “which is to come”?

He that was dead who is alive is to come again as promised.

Rev 19:11 **And I saw heaven opened**, and behold a white horse; and he that sat upon him was called Faithful and True, and in righteousness he doth judge and make war.

Rev 19:13 And he was clothed with a vesture dipped in blood: and **his name is called The Word of God.**

Rev 19:14 And the armies which were in heaven followed him upon white horses, clothed in fine linen, white and clean.

Christ is the one who is “which is to come”

The Word of God in the flesh, which is alive, which was dead and which is to come the Almighty.

Which is to come.
