

Woman two sticks

The woman with Elijah is foreshadow of the end times.

The Woman who trusted the prophet Elijah during the 1260 days of no rain and famines

The woman and widow whose husband had died.

1 kings 17:10 So he arose and went to Zarephath. And when he came to the gate of the city, behold, **a widow** was there **gathering sticks**. And he called to her and said, “Bring me a little water in a vessel, that I may drink.”

11 And as she was going to bring it, he called to her and said, “Bring me a morsel of bread in your hand.”

12 And she said, “As the LORD your God lives, I have nothing baked, only a handful of flour in a jar and a little oil in a jug. And now I am gathering a **couple of sticks** that I may go in and prepare it for myself and my son, that we may eat it and die.”

The widow woman gathered sticks and trusted the prophet.

1 kings 17:14 for thus says the LORD, the God of Israel, ‘The jar of flour shall not be spent, and the jug of oil shall not be empty, until the day that the LORD sends rain upon the earth.’”

15 And she went and did as Elijah said. And she and he and her household ate for many days.

16 The jar of flour was not spent, neither did the jug of oil become empty, according to the word of the LORD that he spoke by Elijah.

The widow woman was fed and taken care of during the time of no rain.

The Prophet.

Rev 11:3 And I will give power unto my **two witnesses**, and they shall prophesy a thousand two hundred and threescore days, clothed in sackcloth.

Rev 11:6 These have power to shut heaven, **that it rain not in the days of their prophecy**: and have power over waters to turn them to blood, and to smite the earth with all plagues, as often as they will.

The woman of Revelation whose husband had died. The widow.

The 1260 days of the Exodus into wilderness during time of Famines and no rain

Rev 12:6 And **the woman** fled into the wilderness, where she hath a place prepared of God, that they should **feed her there** a thousand two hundred and threescore days.

14 And to **the woman** were given two wings of a great eagle, that she might fly into the wilderness, into her place, where she is nourished for a time, and times, and half a time, from the face of the serpent.

This is the widow woman whose husband died.

This widow woman in the days of Elijah gathered two sticks,

1 kings 17:10 So he arose and went to Zarephath. And when he came to the gate of the city, behold, the **widow woman** was **there gathering of sticks**: and he called to her, and said, Fetch me, I pray thee, a little water in a vessel, that I may drink.

1 kings 17:11 And she said, As the LORD thy God liveth, I have not a cake, but an handful of meal in a barrel, and a little oil in a cruse: and, behold, I am gathering two sticks, that I may go in and dress it for me and my son, that we may eat it, and die.

The prophet Ezekiel gathered two sticks for the uniting of the kingdom of Israel.

Ezek 37:16 Moreover, thou son of man, **take thee one stick, and write upon it**, For Judah, and for the children of Israel his companions: **then take another stick, and write upon it**, For Joseph, the stick of Ephraim, and for all the house of Israel his companions:

16 And join them one to another into one stick; and they shall become one in thine hand.

18 And when the children of thy people shall speak unto thee, saying, Wilt thou not shew us what thou meanest by these?

19 Say unto them, Thus saith the Lord GOD; Behold, **I will take the stick of Joseph**, which is in the hand of Ephraim, and the tribes of Israel his fellows, and will put them with him, **even with the stick of Judah**, and make them one stick, and they shall be one in mine hand.

20 And **the sticks** whereon thou writest shall be in thine hand before their eyes.

The woman of Revelation will be gathering two sticks.

The prophet will be taking the two sticks and putting them together to one stick

The widow woman is the uniting of the Israel of God for the exodus.

Taking the two sticks of the wild olive stick branch and the native olive branch and making them one stick.

Romans 11:17 And if some of **the branches be broken off**, and thou, **being a wild olive tree, wert grafted in among them**, and with them partakest of the root and fatness of the olive tree;

18 Boast not against the branches. But if thou boast, thou bearest not the root, but the root thee.

19 Thou wilt say then, **The branches were broken off, that I might be grafted in.**

21 For if God spared not the natural branches, take heed lest he also spare not thee.

22 Behold therefore the goodness and severity of God: on them which fell, severity; but toward thee, goodness, if thou continue in his goodness: otherwise thou also shalt be cut off.

23 And they also, if they abide not still in unbelief, **shall be grafted in: for God is able to graft them in again.**

24 For **if thou wert cut out of the olive tree which is wild by nature**, and wert grafted contrary to nature into a good olive tree: how much more shall these, which be the **natural branches, be grafted into their own olive tree?**

The widow woman gathering sticks with the prophet elijah during the 1260 days of no rain is the prophetic foreshadow of the end times.

The prophet and widow woman will gather the two sticks to make them one stick,
