

Two unharmed

The stories of the bible foreshadow the end times in the accounts of Cain and Job there is hidden prophesy of two witnesses of the end times prophesy.

The law states that by the mouth of two witnesses a matter is established.

Deut 19:15 One witness shall not rise up against a man for any iniquity, or for any sin, in any sin that he sinneth: at the mouth of two witnesses, or at the mouth of three witnesses, shall the matter be established.

The first witness and testimony is of Cain and Lord saying not to touch Cain or harm Cain.

Gen 4:14 Behold, thou hast driven me out this day from the face of the earth; and from thy face shall I be hid; and I shall be a fugitive and a vagabond in the earth; and it shall come to pass, **that every one that findeth me shall slay me.**

Gen 4:15 And the Lord said unto him, **Therefore whosoever slayeth Cain, vengeance shall be taken on him sevenfold.** And the Lord set a mark upon Cain, **lest any finding him should kill him.**

Gen 4:16 And Cain went out from the presence of the Lord, and dwelt in the land of Nod, on the east of Eden.

The Lord sent a boundy that nobody could cross to harm Cain and that anyone daring such would be killed.

The second witness and testimony is of Job and the Lord notifying Satan he has no permission to kill Job.

Job 19 Then Satan answered the Lord, and said, Doth Job fear God for nought?

Job 1:10 Hast not thou made an hedge about him, and about his house, and about all that he hath on every side? thou hast blessed the work of his hands, and his substance is increased in the land.

Job 1:11 But put forth thine hand now, and touch all that he hath, and he will curse thee to thy face.

Job 1:12 And the Lord said unto Satan, Behold, all that he hath is in thy power; **only upon himself put not forth thine hand.** So Satan went forth from the presence of the Lord.

Satan was told he has no permission to kill Job.

These two witnesses foreshadow the end times prophesy of two with the same protection from God.

Rev 11:3 And **I will give power unto my two witnesses, and they shall prophesy** a thousand two hundred and threescore days, clothed in sackcloth.

These are the two prophets of Revelation.

Rev 11:10 And they that dwell upon the earth shall rejoice over them, and make merry, and shall send gifts one to another; because **these two prophets** tormented them that dwelt on the earth.

It is not permitted to kill these two prophets by order of the Lord Himself.

Rev 11:5 And if any man will hurt them, fire proceedeth out of their mouth, and devoureth their enemies: and **if any man will hurt them, he must in this manner be killed.**

Just as Job and Cain these two prophets are not permitted to be killed.

This is the prophesy of the end times foreshadowed in the story of Cain and in the book of Job.

The two testifying of this in the end times prophesy are forbidden to be harmed.

The ones who kill them must be killed.

Rev 11:5 And if any man will hurt them, fire proceedeth out of their mouth, and devoureth their enemies: and **if any man will hurt them, he must in this manner be killed.**

The beast and false prophet are responsible for the killing of the two prophets in the end.

Rev 11:7 And when they shall have finished their testimony, the beast that ascendeth out of the bottomless pit shall make war against them, and **shall overcome them, and kill them.**

This violation is what leads to the beast and false prophet being killed in the end.

Rev 19:20 And **the beast was taken, and with him the false prophet** that wrought miracles before him, with which he deceived them that had received the mark of the beast, and them that worshipped his image. **These both were cast alive into a lake of fire burning with brimstone.**

They violated the command of God that if you kill them you must be killed.

This is the prophesy of the two unharmed found in the story of Cain and the book of Job.
