

Three from dead

The prophetic foreshadow of end times is found in the accounts of Christ raising people from the dead.

The law states that a testimony must be by two or three witnesses to establish a matter.

Deut 19:15 One witness shall not rise up against a man for any iniquity, or for any sin, in any sin that he sinneth: **at the mouth of two witnesses, or at the mouth of three witnesses, shall the matter be established.**

This is two or three required that the matter is established lawfully so all are without excuse.

Three accounts of Christ testify of the prophesy of end times are as following:

one account is Jairas daughter an unmarried virgin was risen resurrected.

Mark 5:22 And, behold, there cometh one of the rulers of the synagogue, Jairus by name; and when he saw him, he fell at his feet,

Mark 5:23 And besought him greatly, saying, My little daughter lieth at the point of death: I pray thee, come and lay thy hands on her, that she may be healed; and she shall live.

Mark 5:35 While he yet spake, there came from the ruler of the synagogue's house certain which said, **Thy daughter is dead**: why troublest thou the Master any further?

Mark 5:41 And he took the damsel by the hand, and said unto her, Talitha cumi; which is, being interpreted, Damsel, I say unto thee, arise.

Mark 5:42 And straightway the damsel arose, and walked; for she was of the age of twelve years. And they were astonished with a great astonishment.

And two men were raised from the dead.

Luke 7:11 And it came to pass the day after, that he went into a city called Nain; and many of his disciples went with him, and much people.

Luke 7:12 Now when he came nigh to the gate of the city, behold, there was a dead man carried out, the only son of his mother, and she was a widow: and much people of the city was with her.

Luke 7:13 And when the Lord saw her, he had compassion on her, and said unto her, Weep not.

Luke 7:14 And he came and touched the bier: and they that bare him stood still. And he said, **Young man**, I say unto thee, Arise.

Luke 7:15 And **he that was dead sat up**, and began to speak. And he delivered him to his mother.

The young man was risen from the grave.

The other account of a man being resurrected is Lazarus.

Luke 7:11 Now a **certain man was sick, named Lazarus**, of Bethany, the town of Mary and her sister Martha.

Luke 7:4 When Jesus heard that, he said, This sickness is not unto death, but for the glory of God, that the Son of God might be glorified thereby.

Luke 7:5 Now Jesus loved Martha, and her sister, and Lazarus.

Luke 7:6 When he had heard therefore that he was sick, he abode two days still in the same place where he was.

He then lets them know Lazarus is dead.

Luke 7:11 These things said he: and after that he saith unto them, Our friend Lazarus sleepeth; but I go, that **I may awake him out of sleep.**

Luke 7:12 Then said his disciples, Lord, if he sleep, he shall do well.

Luke 7:13 Howbeit **Jesus spake of his death**: but they thought that he had spoken of taking of rest in sleep.

Luke 7:14 Then said Jesus unto them plainly, **Lazarus is dead.**

Then others testify of the Resurrection on the last day.

Luke 7:24 Martha saith unto him, I know that **he shall rise again in the resurrection at the last day.**

Luke 7:25 Jesus said unto her, I am the resurrection, and the life: he that believeth in me, though he were dead, yet shall he live:

Then Jesus calls Lazarus to come forth.. and he resurrects.

Luke 7:43 And when he thus had spoken, he cried with a loud voice, **Lazarus, come forth.**

Luke 7:44 And **he that was dead came forth**, bound hand and foot with graveclothes: and his face was bound about with a napkin. Jesus saith unto them, Loose him, and let him go.

This is the prophetic foreshadow of the end times prophesy found in the testifying of two or three witnesses of the resurrection.

The virgin woman and two men being resurrected by Christ.

First the woman the virgin is prophetic foreshadow of the bride being resurrected.

Rev 12:6 And **the woman fled into the wilderness**, where she hath a place prepared of God, that they should feed her there a thousand two hundred and threescore days.

The woman flees into the wilderness for 1260 days at the end which is the Resurrection.

The woman is changed into a resurrection body with the dead to meet the bride groom.

She is a virgin she is not yet married as shes made ready for the wedding which is to come.

Rev 19:7 Let us be glad and rejoice, and give honour to him: **for the marriage of the Lamb is come, and his wife hath made herself ready.**

This is the foreshadow of Jairas daughter in the end times. One of the three witnesses.

There is also two men who are testifying of the Resurrection and them dying and being resurrected on the last day after the 1260 days.

Rev 11:3 And I will give power unto **my two witnesses, and they shall prophesy a thousand two hundred and threescore days**, clothed in sackcloth.

Two testifying for 1260 days same mount of days that the womans in the wilderness.

These are two men.

Rev 11:10 And they that dwell upon the earth shall rejoice over them, and make merry, and shall send gifts one to another; because **these two prophets** tormented them that dwelt on the earth.

Two men dead for 3.5 days like lazarus.

Rev 11:7 And **when they shall have finished their testimony**, the beast that ascendeth out of the bottomless pit shall make war against them, and shall overcome them, **and kill them.**

Rev 11:9 And they of the people and kindreds and tongues and nations shall **see their dead bodies three days and an half**, and shall not suffer their dead bodies to be put in graves.

These two men are Resurrected.

Rev 11:11 And **after three days and an half the spirit of life from God entered into them, and they stood upon their feet**; and great fear fell upon them which saw them.

This is the two men like the young man of nain and lazarus who are raised from the dead after a certain mount of days.

This is the prophetic foreshadow of the end times prophesy that is in the accounts of Christ.

Three witnesses of Resurrection, two prophets with the virgin bride risen at the voice of Christ.

Three from the dead.
